



Alabama SkillsUSA Association Fact Sheet

"Champions at Work"

Alabama SkillsUSA is a partnership of students, teachers, and industry representatives, working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce. It helps each student excel. SkillsUSA is a national nonprofit organization serving teachers and high school and college students who are preparing for careers in trade, technical, and skilled service occupations. It was formerly known as VICA (Vocational Industrial Clubs of America). Chartered in 1969, SkillsUSA has a very proud Alabama heritage.

Membership: During 2018-19 the on-time membership for Alabama SkillsUSA is 19,555 high school and college members. This places Alabama as the 5th highest state in High School Membership and College membership nationally and the highest membership on record in Alabama history.

Mission: SkillsUSA is an applied method of instruction for preparing America's high-performance workers in public career and technical programs. It provides quality education experiences for students in leadership, teamwork, citizenship, and character development. It builds and reinforces self-confidence, work attitudes, and communications skills. It emphasizes total quality at work: high, ethical standards; superior work skills; lifelong education; and pride in the dignity of work. SkillsUSA also promotes understanding of the free-enterprise system and involvement in community service.

Partners: Currently, alumni, teachers, and school administrators serve as professional SkillsUSA members and instructors. More than 100 business, industry, and labor sponsors actively support SkillsUSA at the state level through financial aid, in-kind contributions, and involvement of their people in SkillsUSA activities. Many more work directly with schools and local chapters.

Programs: Alabama SkillsUSA programs include local, state, and national competitions in which students demonstrate technical, occupation, and leadership skills. At the annual national-level SkillsUSA Championships, over 6,000 students compete in 94 occupational and leadership skill areas. More information about the Alabama State Conference and Championships is provided in this document. SkillsUSA programs also help to establish industry standards for job skill training in the lab and classroom and promote community service. SkillsUSA is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and is cited as a "successful model of employer-driven youth development training program" by the U.S. Department of Labor.

This **State Conference and Championships** is the showcase event of the year for the best technical students in Alabama. Many contests begin locally and continue to the state and national levels. This is an extravaganza that takes up the entire East Hall of the Convention Center. In 2018, there were over 2,000 participants in 88 separate events. Nearly 300 judges and contest organizers from labor and management made the state event possible. The philosophy of the Championships is to reward students for excellence, to involve industry in directly evaluating student performance, and to keep training and education relevant to employer needs, education, and student career development. Program credibility is achieved through the use of nationally recognized industry standards.

The partnership with business, industry, and education is critical to the professional and skill development of Alabama's career and technical education students.
