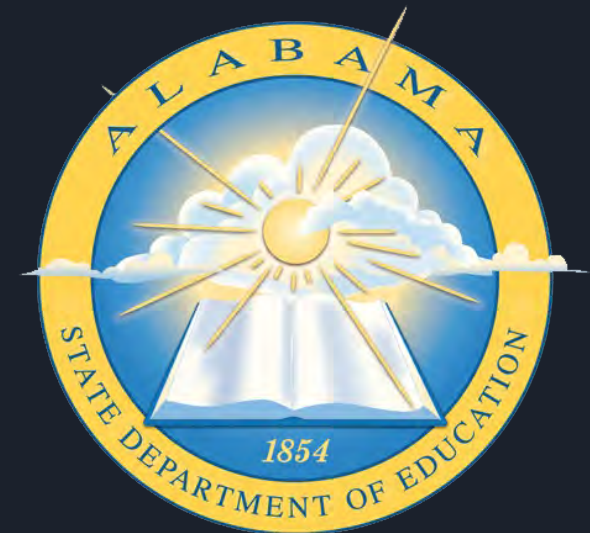

Brief History of the AAEI Grant

- Twenty years plus (Black Belt Initiative)
- Organizations advocating and providing leadership in Arts Education: ALAA, AIEA, ASCA, ALC
- ALC Plan for Arts Education: Organizations, Individuals and Legislators
- Funding over time
 - 2015 to 2023 \$8,900,693 granted to schools from the AAEI Grant
 - FY2015 \$500,000, FY2016 \$800,000, FY2017 to FY2021 \$1.3 million, FY2022 increased to \$1.5 million, FY23 \$1.7 million, FY24 \$2 million

AAEI Goals

- Provide and increase equitable access to quality arts education to facilitate artistic literacy.
- Assist schools in developing arts programs or supplementing existing arts programs to create capacity for sustainability and long-term educational impact.
- Advance arts education opportunities to enhance the whole child while developing college and career readiness.
- Use arts programs as a catalyst to create and maintain an engaged school and community.

Arts Literacy

- Arts literacy consists of the knowledge, understanding, and skills required to participate authentically in the arts and results from high-quality arts education that inspires and engages lifelong learning for all Alabama students.

 - What are the resources you will need?
 - What activities will take place?
 - What are some of the planned strategies?



FIVE COMPONENTS OF A WELL-DEVELOPED PROPOSAL (Who and What)

- WHO and WHAT will be part of the work?
 - Teachers, Leadership, Central Office, Businesses, Parents, Community Organizations?
 - New Equipment?
 - Other Resources?



FIVE COMPONENTS OF A WELL-DEVELOPED PROPOSAL (Cost)

- HOW much will it cost?
 - Artist(s), Technical Advisor(s) or School Wide Training(s)
 - Equipment
 - Supplies (expendable materials)
 - Professional Development
 - Consider In-Kind, Ticket Sales, Monetary Donations, School System support, and Local School support as part of the budget



FIVE COMPONENTS OF A WELL-DEVELOPED PROPOSAL (Impact)

- **HOW will you evaluate your proposal?**
 - Focus on the original goal(s).
 - What data was used to support the need?
 - How will you measure the data to determine outcomes?
 - Survey school climate, growth of a program, and/or student engagement.
 - Collect and analyze data such as attendance, discipline, and/or pre- and post assessments.
 - What evidence will you have?
 - What evidence will provide proof of sustainability for the project?



FIVE COMPONENTS OF A WELL-DEVELOPED PROPOSAL

WHAT is your problem and intended outcomes?

HOW do you plan to solve it? What strategies and resources will be used?

WHO will be part of the work? Resources

HOW much will it cost? Personnel, Materials, Equipment and In-Kind.

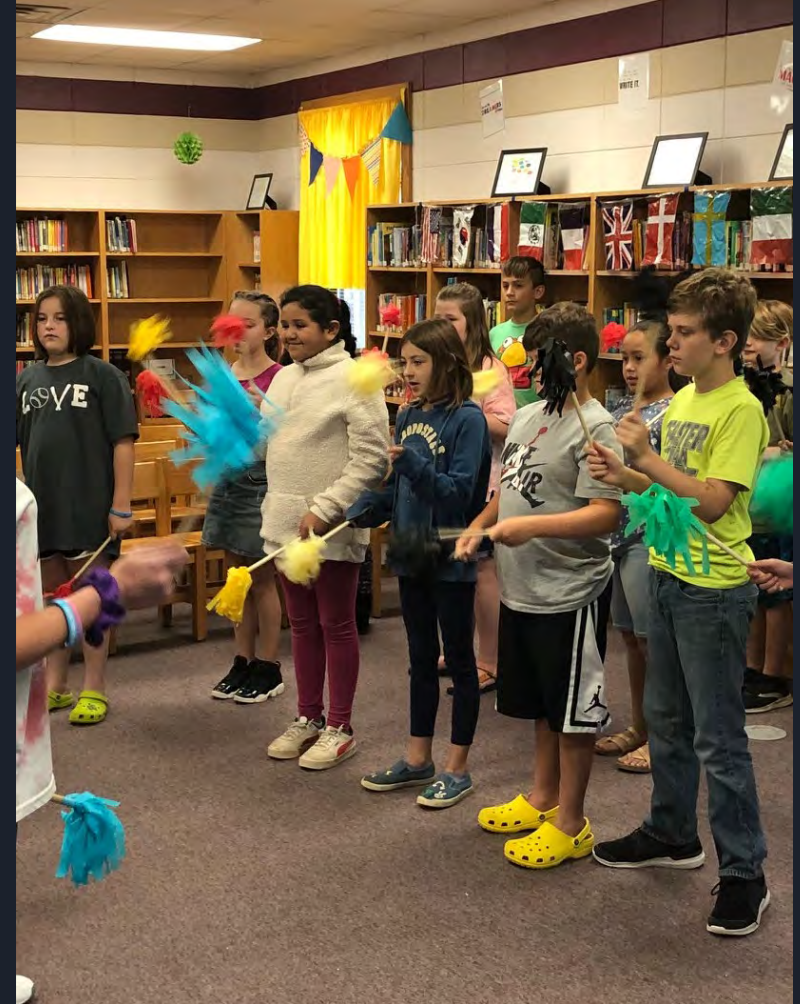

Escambia County High School Evidence of Growing an Arts Program

- Escambia County High School Student Scholarship Awards
 - Student trumpet player received a full tuition from Coastal Alabama Community College
 - Student tuba player received \$17,600 from Alabama A&M University.
 - Student horn player received \$19,200 from Alabama A&M University.
 - Student tenor saxophonist received \$56,000 from Huntingdon College.
 - Student clarinetist that graduated last year during the pandemic and waited until this year to audition received \$8,000 from Troy University.
 - The music program received Superior ratings for the first time at competition.



AAEI Grant Application for Schools

- Eligibility

- If a school or community organization received AAEI grant funding of a maximum of \$40,000.00 over a four-year period, then the school or community organization is ineligible to apply for an AAEI grant for a two-year period from the last funding cycle the organization received. (Example: Sample School met the \$40,000.00 maximum in FY2020 then the school may not apply until FY 2023 grant cycle.)

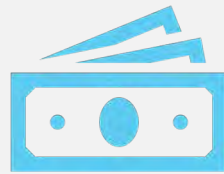

AAEI Grant Application for Schools (Application) Budget

- **Previous AAEI Grant Recipients & Restrictions**
 - A grant recipient that received funding the previous year may apply for half of the total of the original grant award over the next two years
 - Example: Year 1 \$20,000, Year 2 \$10,000, Year 3 10,000 then cycle off for two years
 - \$40,000 over four years, must cycle off for two years
 - Three consecutive years of funding, must cycle off for two years

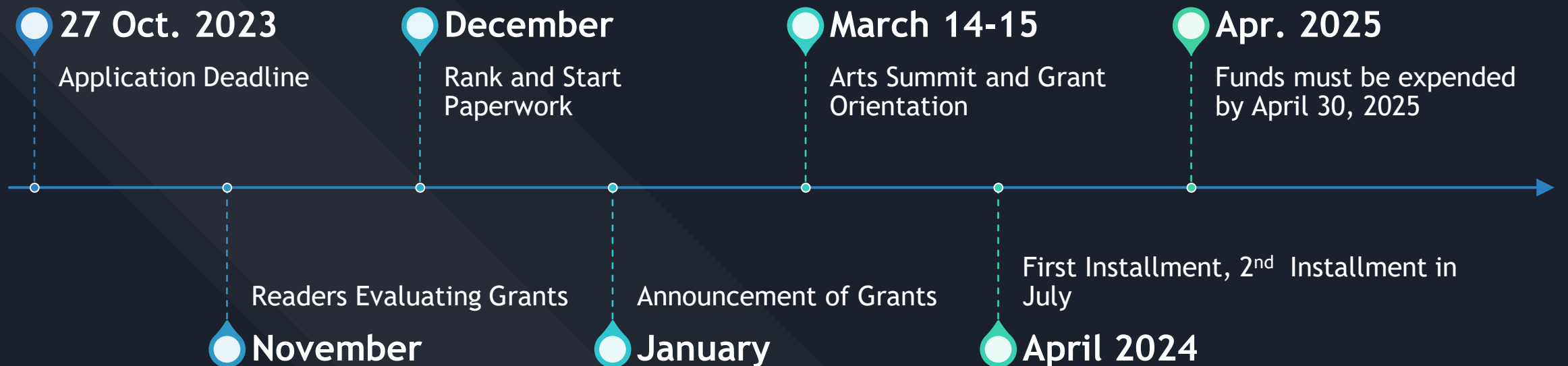

Completeness:

Have you addressed all parts of the AAEL Grant?



Responsiveness:

Are you responding to the specifications?

Are you responding to the general interest and purpose?

Are you responding to a **REAL** need or problem?

What else should you consider?



Consistency

All parts should be consistent and related to each other.

Budget must be clear, reasonable, and MATCH your proposal.



Capability

Can you accomplish what you plan on doing? Can you carry out your plan?

Can you show evidence of plans to assure sustainability and funding for the future?



What else should you consider?

- **Be Realistic**

- Do not promise more than you can achieve based on time and resources provided!

AAEI Grant Considerations



Complete the application, and review each section of the grant



Be clear, concise, and realistic. Do not simply repeat the goals, but provide a clear explanation of how the goals will be met



Choose GRANT READERS that are able and willing to do the work involved; this is important to the process and to your grant proposal.



Leverage community partnerships.

AAEI Grant Considerations



Sustainability

Is the project sustainable even without future AAEI grant funding?

Does the project have support needed to grow the arts programming proposed?



Budget

Does the budget provide enough information for a reviewer to understand the project?

Does the budget balance?

Is the budget realistic?

Does the budget show

- In-kind support?
- Community support?



The Devil is in the Details!

- **BEFORE YOU HIT SUBMIT**

- Have someone unfamiliar with your project read the proposal.
 - Does the proposal make sense?
 - Can they understand what the problem is and what you want to accomplish?
 - Are there parts missing from the proposal?

- **PROOFREAD!!!**

- Find a strong proofreader and ask them to read for content and grammar.

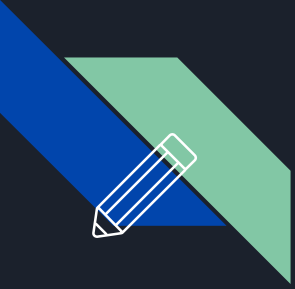


The Devil is in the Details!

- A proposal is read one time with three possible outcomes:
- THIS IS GOOD!!!
- THIS HAS POTENTIAL, MAY BE WORTH ANOTHER LOOK?
- THEY DO NOT KNOW WHAT THEY ARE TALKING ABOUT!!!
 - How can this actually happen?
 - Budget makes no sense.
 - Blah, blah, blah, blah...

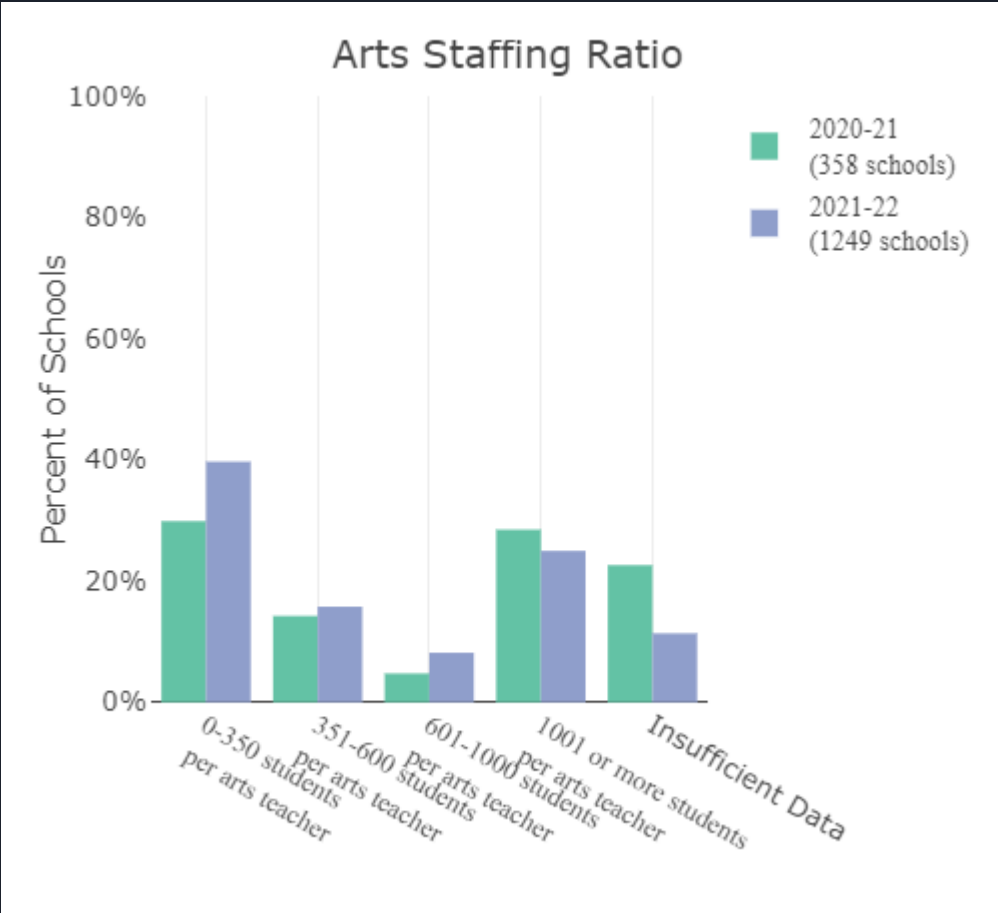

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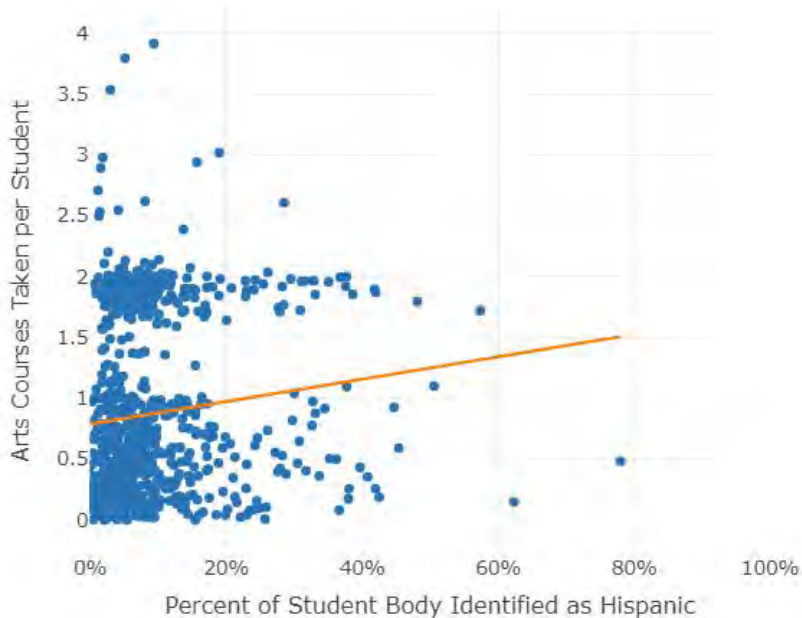
Arts Courses Taken per Student by School Demographic Makeup

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CREATIVE SCHOOLS SURVEY

Arts Liaisons enter detailed information on arts education access and quality in the fall of each school year.

CREATIVE SCHOOLS CERTIFICATION SCORING

The Creative Schools Certification (CSC) provides a quantitative summary score that shows how successfully each school in Chicago Public Schools (CPS) provides students access to the arts. Data for the CSC is compiled from responses on the annual Creative Schools Survey, as well as from administrative data provided directly by the District.

Over the last two years, Ingenuity and CPS have worked together to advance the thinking behind the CSC and arrived at an improved "CSC 2.0" metric. This evolved version of the Certification brings increased nuance to the "Access" measures, while adding weight and detail to the "Quality" measures. Beginning in 2021, Ingenuity and the CPS Department of Arts Education will publish annual individual Roadmaps for each CPS school. The Roadmap will provide each school with detailed data on their CSC 2.0 score, highlight the unique arts strengths in their school, and identify specific growth opportunities to assist schools in improving arts equity for their students and increasing their Certification scores.

Schools receive a Certification rating from Emerging to Excelling.

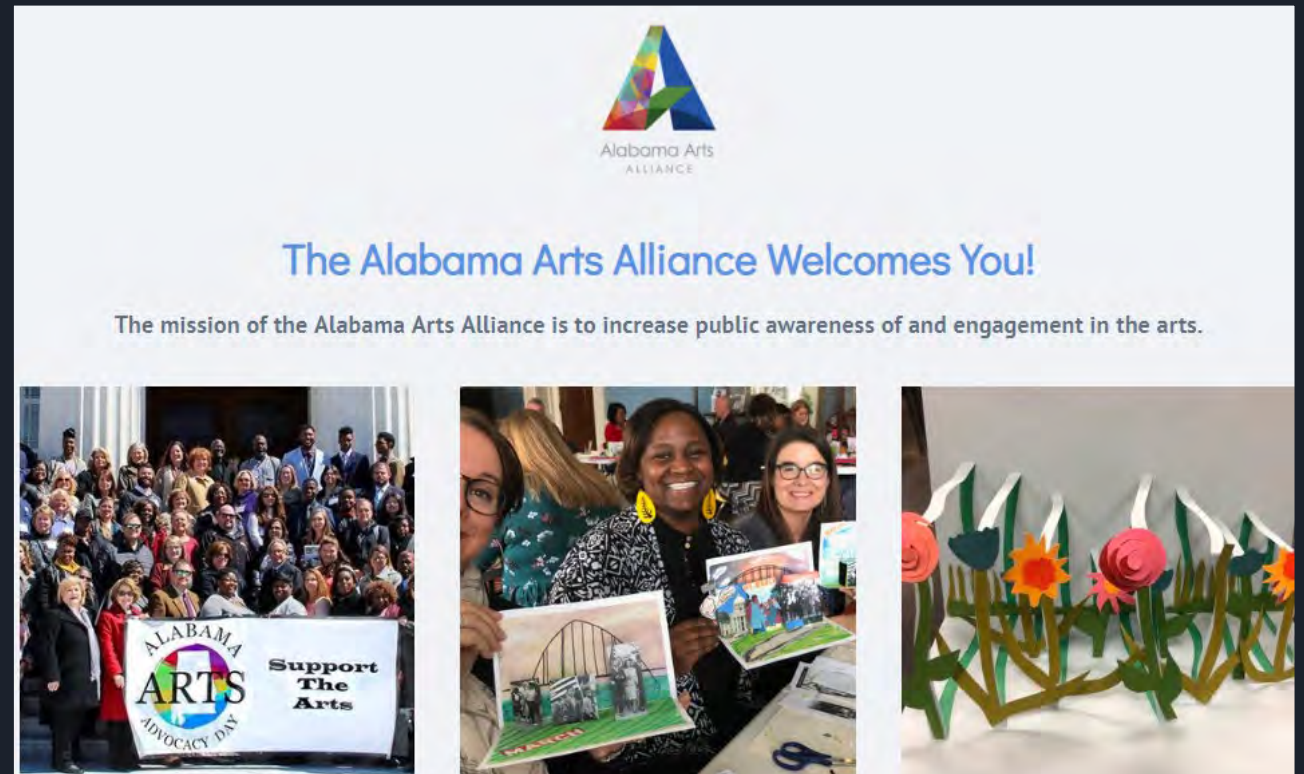

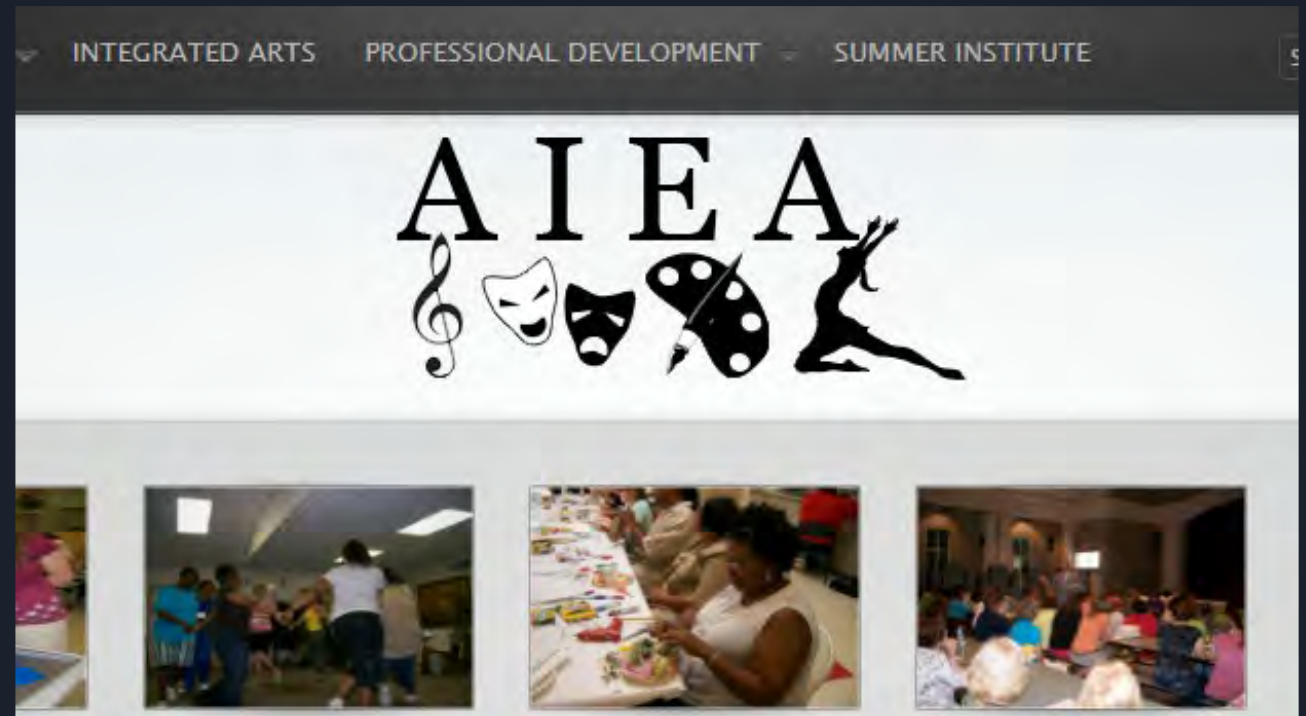
