APPENDIX A

CAREER TECH OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE

The funds will be allocated based on each Local Education Agency's (LEA) career and technical education (CTE) full-time equivalent, including JROTC instructors. The amount allocated to each LEA is attached to this Appendix. These funds can be used in the same manner as traditional Career Tech Operations and Maintenance (O&M) funds, which are appropriated annually in the Education Trust Fund budget. Specifically, they can be used for the following purposes related to CTE student instruction:

- **Equipment:** The purchase of equipment necessary for CTE programs based on Alabama State Department of Education approved program equipment lists.
- **Consumables:** Procurement of consumable items required for CTE instructional activities.
- **Materials and Supplies:** Acquisition of materials and supplies directly related to approved CTE courses and programs.

Approval to spend supplemental Career Tech O&M funds on items exceeding a \$10,000 per unit cost will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis and will require prior approval. These funds will be automatically disbursed before the start of the school year. To account for the revenue and expenditures associated with these funds, use fund source 1771. All funds should be expended by **September 30, 2025**.

APPENDIX B

College and Career Readiness Supplemental Appropriations

Act 2024-428 appropriated \$17,000,000 to be allocated in grants to continue expansion of support for activities that increase students' awareness of postsecondary opportunities resulting in closing the gap between Graduation Rates and College and Career Readiness. To facilitate the approval process for the College and Career Readiness funds, an application is required. Applications will be prioritized by those schools with a difference of 15% or greater between CCR and Graduation Rate on the Alabama Education Report Card. LEAs may apply for up to \$200,000 per high school to support efforts in closing the gap. Application submissions are due by **August 2, 2024**.

Recommendations from the Offices of Career and Technical Education and Student Learning have been provided below; however, focus should be given to **closing the gap between CCR and Graduation Rates**. The following expenditures are not allowable: salaries, benefits, computer hardware, clothing, food, and incentives/gifts. If funded, an impact and expenditure report will be required. Application Process

Before initiating this PowerForm, a best practice is to create a free DocuSign account ([DocuSign](#)). This will allow you (the originator) to track the envelope as it progresses through each assigned recipient. The account creation MUST occur prior to starting the PowerForm for the FY24 College and Career Readiness Supplemental Appropriations. Please use the link below for the application.

First, enter the name and email address of each person who will be assigned one of the signing roles listed below. Then, click on the "Begin Signing" button. A window will appear with a message prompting you to enter the validation/access code. Please note that if you fail the authentication twice, the envelope will lock and you will need to contact Meagen Anthony-Rush (meagen.anthony@alsde.edu) to unlock the envelope. If you copy and paste the code, ensure that no extra spaces are copied and pasted into the textbox.

After the validation/access code has been verified, you will be prompted to continue to enter the information required to complete the form.

Once all the required fields have been completed, you will be prompted to click the "Finish" button. Upon clicking the "Finish" button, the envelope will automatically be sent to the next signer until all signatures have been collected. Please note that during the electronic signing process, all signers will receive an email inviting them to sign the document.

To track an envelope, you MUST have created a free DocuSign account PRIOR to the submission of the envelope. To check the status of an envelope, you will login to your DocuSign account. Access the "Manage" tab to track the envelope. It will show you the status of the envelope, such as whose signature has been collected and whose signature you may be waiting on.
