FOUR ALABAMA SCHOOL DISTRICTS HONORED WITH HEALTHY MEALS INCENTIVES RECOGNITION AWARD

Elmore County Schools, Hale County Schools, Haleyville City Schools, and Marshall County Schools to Attend Healthy Meals Summit in Las Vegas

MONTGOMERY, Ala. – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Action for Healthy Kids (AHK) has recognized four Alabama school districts – Elmore County Schools, Hale County Schools, Haleyville City Schools, and Marshall County Schools – with a Healthy Meals Incentives (HMI) Recognition Award.



Three districts – Hale County Schools, Haleyville City Schools, and Marshall County Schools – received the Innovation in Nutrition Education award which recognizes the implementation of nutrition education activities that make classroom, cafeteria, community, and home connections for students and parents/guardians.

Elmore County Schools received notification that they were also selected for an HMI award – Innovation in the Preparation of School Meals – which recognizes schools who plan and prepare scratch recipes for school breakfast and lunch. Each of these districts held impactful Team Nutrition Open House

events which were a component of the FY 22 Team Nutrition Training Grant awarded to the Alabama State Department of Education.
