Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Alabama Reading Initiative (ARI) Local Reading Specialist(s) Allocations for Kindergarten through Third Grade Schools

The Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) and the Alabama Reading Initiative (ARI) are committed to providing systematic support for ARI local reading specialists, school administrators, classroom teachers, and district leaders as outlined in the <u>Alabama Literacy Act 2019-523</u>, including districts that have a virtual school.

The schools included in the attachment have already completed the <u>MOU/MOA for a local reading specialist</u>, agreeing to implement the ARI Local Reading Specialist job description and designating one individual per school with any combination of kindergarten through third grade to serve in the local reading specialist role. These schools will receive the allocation outlined in the July 22, 2024, memorandum and noted in the attachment on a quarterly basis. These allocations are 100 percent state funds and should be budgeted and expended using revenue and fund source 1230, as indicated in slide 21 of the <u>Alabama Reading Initiative (ARI)</u> <u>Comprehensive Planning and Alabama Literacy Act's PowerPoint</u>. If an allocation is not noted for a school or local education agency, please reach out to the Regional Literacy Leadership Specialist with the completed <u>MOU/MOA for a local reading specialist</u> to work toward the acquisition of the funds. Any additional allocations will be granted upon completion of this document.

The work of the local reading specialist is key to the success of the *Alabama Literacy Act*. Allocated funds **<u>must</u>** be directed toward local reading specialists in K-3 schools. If your district has not yet completed this process, please complete the MOU/MOA process as stated in the memorandum.

We look forward to a successful year as we all work together for "Every Child. Every Chance. Every Day."
