ALABAMA ACT 2012-402

The Legislative School Performance Recognition Program was created within the State Department of Education to reward public schools that either:

- Demonstrate high performance by being ranked in the top 25 percent of public schools, as ranked in the school grading system, or
- Demonstrate exemplary progress by improving the overall annual ranking of the school by at least one letter grade, as ranked in the school grading system

BUSINESS RULES

Top 25% Schools

- Retrieve all schools within the grading system with their Total Points Earned
- Remove closed schools and schools labeled as “ID.”
- Determine top 25% of schools based on Total Points Earned
- Select the top 25 schools from the top 25%

Most Improved Schools

- Retrieve all schools within the grading system with their Total Points Earned
- Remove closed schools and schools labeled as “ID.”
- Remove top 25% schools already identified
- Retrieve the Total Points Earned for the remaining schools from the previous year
- Remove schools not improving at least one (1) letter grade
- Select the 25 schools with the greatest improvement from the previous year
