RE: Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Allocations for Summer Math Camps - **REVISED**

[Act 2023-378](#) makes supplemental appropriations available for 2025 Summer Math Camps. **Attachment A** outlines the requirements for funding. The first requirement is for the local education agency (LEA) to provide contact information for one LEA representative who will receive summer math camp communications from the Alabama State Department of Education by completing the [OMI Summer Math Camp FY25 form](#), by April 1, 2025.

Attachment B (Revised) contains the allocations for Summer Math Camps (Fund Code 1769). Each LEA will receive a summer math camp allocation on a per-pupil basis according to the number of K-5 students identified with a math deficiency on a beginning of the year Formative Benchmark Assessment. Funds will be distributed in April 2025. Also, funds do not roll over, and all funds should be expended by September 30, 2025.

**2025 SUMMER MATH CAMPS
Requirements for Funding**

1. Complete the [OMI Summer Math Camp FY25 form](#), providing the contact information for the LEA summer math camp contact, by April 1, 2025.
2. Budget and utilized funds for the following purposes **ONLY**:
 - a. To pay stipends to general education and/or special education teachers for teaching Grades K-5 students in summer math camp (inclusive of teachers embedding math in reading instruction for Grades K-3).
 - b. To pay stipends to instructional assistants or paraprofessionals supporting students in Grades K-5 summer math camp.
 - c. To pay child nutrition staff to support meal preparation for students in Grades K-5 during established hours of the summer math camp.
 - d. To pay bus drivers and defray associated costs incurred by transporting students in Grades K-5 to and from summer math camp.
 - e. To purchase instructional equipment, materials, and supplies needed to effectively implement summer math camp for students in Grades K-5.
3. Use PowerSchool Student Analytics and Insights for attendance and data entry purposes.
4. Administer the Formative Benchmark Assessment to all students receiving mathematics instruction within the Summer Testing Window (June 1–July 31, 2025), as published in the [July 8, 2024, memo](#).
